THE ENLISTMENT PROCESS

STEP 1: INITIAL INTERVIEW

It all starts with a phone call to your local recruiter. This phone call will determine your qualification. If qualified, your recruiter will set a day and time to meet inperson and answer questions.

STEP 2: INITIAL PAPERWORK

If qualified, you will start the process to become an active applicant with the Air Force. This paperwork is usually done during the initial interview. You will also be given an application to fill out as well.

STEP 3: ASVAB & MEPS

Your recruiter will pick a day & time for you to take the ASVAB (entry test). This test will determine careers you academically qualify for. Next, you will then see doctors for a physical to ensure you are healthy to join. During the physical, you will have several others exams administered.

STEP 4: Delayed Entry Program (DEP)

You will swear into the DEP to reserve your spot in line for basic training. During this timeframe, your recruiter will prepare you for basic training.

STEP 5: BMT

Basic Military Training is 8.5 weeks at Lackland AFB, located in San Antonio, Texas.

STEP 6: TECH SCHOOL

4-52 weeks depending on your career and can be located in a few different states.

STEP 7: RAP

After tech school, you get to come back home for 12 days of free vacation before the Air Force moves you to your first base!
