School: Pendleton High School has an enrollment of approximately 800 students in grades 9-12. It is served by an early learning center, three elementary schools and one middle school.

Faculty: The faculty of Pendleton High School consists of the principal, two assistant principals, three guidance counselors, one Native American counselor, and approximately 40 full time teachers.

Simultaneous Enrollment: Students needing to make up credits to meet graduation requirements may be enrolled in the PHS Credit Retrieval Learning Lab or PHS Summer School.

Schedule: The school day is divided into seven 41 minute classes (Monday) and 45 minute classes (Tuesday-Friday). Students can earn up to .5 credits per semester per class and up to 3.5 credits per semester. Two additional classes are available during zero period. Semester grades appear on transcripts.

Grading System: Grades are designated by A, B, C, D, F, P, N, G, or I. P indicates pass with credit; N indicates no pass, no credit; G indicates no grade; I indicates incomplete.

Grading Framework: Final grades are based on the following general guidelines: College level class-10% practice & 90% assessment; Senior level class-20% practice & 80% assessment; Junior level class-25% practice & 75% assessment; Sophomore level class-30% practice & 70% assessment; Freshman level class-35% practice & 65% assessment; Below grade level class-40% practice & 60% assessment.

Class Rank: The students' cumulative GPA is listed in order from the highest to the lowest and linked with the number of students in the class to establish class rank.

Unweighted vs. Weighted Grades: Transcripts include both weighted and unweighted grades. Weighted courses on the transcript will be identified with an asterisk * after the course title.

Unweighted Grades: A=4 B=3 C=2 D=1 F=0 P=0 N=0 G=0

Weighted Grades: The following classes are graded on a 5.0 scale:, AP Language and Composition, AP Literature and Composition, Spanish 3, Spanish 4, Honors Biology 1, AP Biology, Honors Chemistry, Physics, Honors Geometry, Honors Algebra 2, College Algebra, Pre-Calculus/Trigonometry, AP Calculus, AP World History, AP US History, and AP Government.

Graduation Requirements: 24.0 credits, demonstration of proficiency in reading, writing, math and the Oregon Department of Education Career Related Learning Components are required to graduate. Credit requirements are as follows:

Modified Diploma: Students with an IEP who have demonstrated an inability to meet the full set of academic content standards required for a regular high school diploma may earn a modified diploma. The credit requirements for a modified diploma are: Language Arts 3.0, Mathematics 2.0, Science 2.0, Social Studies 2.0, Health 1.0, Physical Education 1.0, Success 101 .5, Fine Arts 1.0, and Electives 11.5.

Core Curriculum Explanation:

Language Arts: Classes include:English 1-4, Writing Workshop, Poetry as Literature, Science Fiction as Lit, Myth to Modern Fiction; Advanced Level- Pre-AP English 1 & 2, AP English Language and Composition, AP Literature and Composition. Electives include Yearbook.

Mathematics: Classes: include Pre-Algebra, Algebra Readiness, Algebra 1, Geometry, Honors Geometry, Financial Algebra, Algebra 2, Honors Algebra 2, College Algebra, Pre-Calculus/Trigonometry, and AP Calculus.

Science: Classes include: Earth Science, Physical Science, Biology, Animal Science, Plant Science, Vet Science, Crop & Soil Science, Aerospace, and Chemistry; Advanced level- Honors Biology 1, Honors Chemistry, AP Biology, and Physics.

Social Studies:Classes include: World History/Geography, U.S. History, and Civics/Economics; Advanced level- AP World History, AP U.S. History and AP Government.

Foreign Language: Classes include: Spanish 1-4.

Special Programs: For students on an IEP, modified classes are available.
